Themes: Fantasy | Words | Ice Cream

- Play the Meet-the-Author Recording for your class, then read Chapter 1 of A Snicker of Magic. You can also use the ebook preview.
- Felicity Pickle collects words. Have each reader start a section in their notebook to collect words that appeal to them.
- Dr. Zook invents new ice cream flavors. Ask your students to imagine a new flavor and write a short description of how it came to be.
- Create found poems using collected words from your students. You'll find other ideas in this <u>teacher's guide</u>.
