

### **Book Ideas**




#### **The Superteacher Project**

Themes: Science Fiction | Humor | School

- Launch your read aloud by browsing Korman's <u>author page</u>. How many of his books has your class read? Listen for the humor in his <u>Audio Name Pronunciation</u>.
- Create a <u>wordsearch</u> with students and add suggested words or other important vocabulary. Display it on the board to complete as a group or print for individual use.
- · Access group discussion questions in this guide.
- Browse the <u>ebook preview</u> and discuss how the author's chapter titles alert students to different character points of view.



#### <u>Infinite Hope</u>

by Ashley Bryan

Themes: Nonfiction | Memoir | World War II

- Show Ashley Bryan's <u>Meet-the-Author Movie</u>. You can stop at 57 seconds or enjoy the whole 5-minute movie.
- Learn how Bryan's experience in World War II impacted his life with this book trailer.
- Discover resources to use throughout the reading process in this guide.
- Share this <u>interview</u> with students. Provide time for them to read the article, then discuss or write about what they learn.

## **Author Study Ideas**



#### <u>Jasmine Warga</u>

- Introduce the author by playing her Audio Name Pronunciation.
- Explore resources for other titles written by Jasmine Warga.
- Ask students to explore 3 of Warga's interviews with a partner. What did they learn?
- Use the share tool to create a shelf card for the <u>author</u>, adding to book baskets, displays, or shelves.
