

Themes: Biography | African American | Musicians

- View the author's book trailer. Compare and contrast the two book trailers.
- Explore resources about the author and the backstory of this picture book with this Virtual Book Tour blog post.
- Play the <u>Meet-the-Author Recording</u>. What do students learn about Nina Simone that changed the course of her life?



#### Finally Heard

Themes: Realistic Fiction | Asian American | Social Media

- Explore prereading activities from the <u>curriculum guide</u> like the T-chart to discuss the pros and cons of social media.
- Launch National Social Media Day with *Finally Heard* by watching this <u>video book reading</u> read by the author.
- Guide conversation about the book reading with this curriculum guide.
- Invite students to consider what they learned and how they can connect it to their own lives using this <u>activity kit</u>.

#### **Ruth Behar**

- Introduce the author with her Audio Name Pronunciation.
- Spend time with the author by watching the complete video reading of <u>Tia Fortuna's New Home</u>. Pause the recording to answer her questions, then play her Q and A to learn even more about the author.
- Explore resources for other titles written by Ruth Behar.
- Use the share tool to create a shelf card for the <u>author</u> to add to book baskets, displays, or shelves.
